Trips

Due to the rise in prices and in particular the cost of transport, trips are becoming increasingly expensive. Parental contributions are voluntary however, as school does not have a dedicated budget to pay for trips, if we do not receive enough in contributions then the trip would not be able to go ahead. We are able to offer some help to families who are in receipt of pupil premium. To try to assist families with budgeting we intend to get a list of planned trips for the year to you after half term.



Within school we will continue to offer, free of charge, a wide range of opportunities and activities such as Bhangra dancing, alternatives sports and guest speakers. We will also continue to fund the sports/breakfast club which we hope parents are finding useful.

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
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House Winners

Linford Class

Wow what a first few weeks we have had! The EYFS children have settled into school life extremely well and have enjoyed learning about different animals, created repeating patterns and can confidently count and order numbers to 5. The older children have taken the move to year 1 in their stride and have worked on letter formation, sentences with adjectives, lists and labels. In maths they have been looking at place value, addition and numberbonds. All of the children enjoyed reading, writing and creating a scarecrow linked to the story *The Tiger Who Came To Tea*. In fact, the Tiger is still dining in our outside area but he is beginning to look the worse for wear! It has been an amazing half term and we are looking forward to next term.



Bradgate Class

Wow, what an amazing (and busy!) start to the year we have had in Bradgate Class! We have enjoyed our history topic on Florence Nightingale, and compared nursing in the Victorian Times to nursing today. We had a nurse visit us at school and we were able to make plaster casts, check our heart rate and oxygen levels, and experiment with bandages and slings! In English we have been focusing on writing simple sentences, ensuring that we have used capital letters and full stops in the correct places and using adjectives to add description. Our writing has been inspired by the stories 'The Day the Crayons Quit', 'Zog', and 'Oliver's Vegetables'. We have also been working hard in maths, ensuring that we use lots of concrete resources to support our learning. In Art we have compared the Spanish artists, Picasso and Gaudi.





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Tyburn Class

Tyburn have had a very exciting first term exploring our Ancient Egypt theme! The children have had lots of fun making pyramids, mummifying tomatoes and even handling 3000-year-old artefacts at New Walk museum. In Science, we have been learning lots about sound and have explored vibrations and how sound travels over distances. Tyburn have produced some excellent writing including writing their own chapter of our book "Mouse, Bird, Snake, Wolf" and instructions for how to mummify. We have been learning all about 3 and 4 digit numbers in maths and have begun to look at adding and subtracting them this week. Well done for all the great work Tyburn!




Old John Class

In Old John, we've had a half term focused on our topic: Heart & Health.

In our writing, we've written a narrative based off our class book, Pig Heart Boy, and tried to fill it with plenty of suspense and tension to keep the reader eager to read on about what happens next.

We've also written an explanation text about our favourite topic. We've had fantastic writing about Bollywood, Anne Frank and the British Empire, as well as other amazing topics!

In our Maths, we've been coming to grips with our knowledge of Place Value, and building upon our knowledge around multiplication and division, as well as adding and subtracting larger numbers and using negative numbers, too.



In our Theme, we've been learning about the human body – specifically, the circulatory system – as well as the development of medicine over the time in Britain. We've learnt all about the Black Death, James Lind and scurvy, as well as the creation of vaccination by Edward Jenner (a hero, or a villain?) and Florence Nightingale's legacy.

For our art, we've learnt about Leonardo da Vinci and sketched some of our own amazing inventions to help in the classroom.

Of course, we had an amazing Harvest Festival and Scarecrow Festival, in which we created the ghoulish, terrifying, tragic Frankenstein! We also sung our Harvest Shanty, which the children only had a few weeks to learn and did brilliantly in. We're incredibly proud of all the hard work Old John has done this half term and can't wait to see what we can accomplish next.
