Well once again we have had a very busy half term! We have been learning about and recreating artwork in the style of Kandinsky, Mondrian and Rothko. In geography we have looked at the features of a map, found out about the 4 countries of the UK and their capital cities and discussed life in both urban and rural settings. We have enjoyed looking at objects and the materials they are

made from in science and have tested a variety of objects to see if the float or sink. In maths we have done lots of counting as well as measuring and weighing. Our book focus has been Stick Man and we have been adding adjectives to make our sentences more exciting.

Also well done to the EYFS parents for doing your letters really well too! We are looking forward to next half term when we will be looking at transport, finding out about Easter and going on a trip to the Curve! In English we have written the story of Tiddler by Julia Donaldson, then innovated the story by changing the characters and setting to create our own story. We are really proud of the children's writing as they included lots of description, as well as remembering their neat handwriting, capital letters and full stops! We have also learnt about famous explorers (polar and space explorers!) and where these people's adventures fit into a timeline of historical events. Our science, computing, DT and history topics all came together as we designed our own rockets, considered the most appropriate materials to use, and

went outside to blast them off! Our next half-term's topic will be geography focused; 'Magical Mapping', and we will be writing a recount about a walk around our local area. We are also looking forward to our upcoming theatre trip!


In school we have been very engaged and trying really hard with our timetables and spellings. As well as continuing to develop great social skills and working really well as a team.
