## **Our Vision**

At Newtown Linford Primary School, we offer all children high quality and bespoke learning experiences to ensure all pupils are well-equipped for their next stages of education and for their futures. Our creative and challenging curriculum has been organised through a 'topic-based' approach, which incorporates the key knowledge, skills and vocabulary as set out in the National Curriculum. We set high expectations of learners to enable them to build independence.

## **Phonics and Reading**

At the heart of learning to read is decoding therefore high-quality phonics and Early Reading provision is crucial to producing successful readers. At Newtown Linford phonics learning is delivered following Little Wandle scheme. Daily phonics teaching takes the form of teacher modelling, songs, stories, rhymes and multisensory learning. Children are taught the sounds in class and individual reading books are mapped onto current learning to give the child the opportunity to practise recognising and decoding new sounds.

## **Celebrating Success!**

Our behaviour system at Newtown Linford Primary is very simple. We expect children to behave well at school, respect each other and all adults and give their all to their learning.

We remind pupils of the rules regularly and if rules are broken, we support our children to reflect on how they may act differently in the same situation again.



We reward positive behaviour through our Dojo Points System. Pupils feel a great sense of achievement when they are awarded with Dojo Points for their hard work. These accumulate towards individual bronze, silver and gold stars which children wear on their uniforms.







## Whole school rewards- House system

Each pupil in the school will be allocated to a house colours from our school logo

Each house will have a Year 6 house captain

Using our Dojo system for rewarding behaviour that match our school values, we collect the total number of Dojo's achieved by each house on a weekly basis. At the end of each term, the house with the most Dojo's will be presented with the school house trophy and earn a non-uniform day on the Friday of that week

## Pupil Progress and Support at home

Communicating pupils' educational journey is extremely important to us at Newtown Linford Primary School. We hold two formal parents' evenings per year; one in the Autumn term and one in the Spring. We also communicate with parents for any additional important information.

As a school, we expect parents to support their child with homework on their journey through school, with a particular focus on reading, at least three times per week. In addition to this, we set age-appropriate learning on a weekly basis.

#### **School Uniform**

Our School uniform is compulsory and consists of a jumper or cardigan with our school logo, a white stiff collared shirt and school tie. Pupils may wear grey trousers, shorts, skirts or dresses. In the summer, girls may wear a navy blue gingham dress. Shoes must be black, navy or brown and smart.

Our PE uniform consist of a navy top with logo, black shorts, leggings (with logo) or jogging bottoms and plimsolls. For outdoor PE, pupils should wear a warm school tracksuit in the winter and trainers.

Jumpers, cardigans, ties and PE kits are only available from the school.
