Topic title: Vikings Key question: What did the Vikings want and how did Alfred stop them from getting it?

Key outcomes:

During this theme pupils will learn about the Viking invasion of Britain, about the resistance by Alfred the Great and Athelstan, first king of England and who Edward the Confessor is and about his death in 1066.

They will also learn about electricity, how our understanding of electricity has changed over time and how to construct a working circuit. They will use their computing skills to design a webpage for England and why it is a good place to visit.
