

Newtown Linford Primary School Half Termly Topic Overview Old John Autumn Term 2 2023

Key outcomes: In this theme, the children will learn about the causes and symptoms of cholera and explain why this very infectious disease caused thousands of deaths during epidemics in cities such as Birmingham in Victorian times. They will then learn about reservoirs and how these are built to supply towns and cities with fresh water.
