#### **School Council**


The School Council is now meeting on Monday lunch with Mrs Hamm.

#### **Linford Class**

We have thoroughly enjoyed our Geography-based topic this term, all about London. The children are now experts at naming and locating famous landmarks in the capital city, and after looking at aerial view maps to



compare London and Newtown Linford, we thought about where we would prefer to live and why. Continuing our theme of London, in English we have been listening to and retelling the stories 'Katie in London' and 'The Queen's Hat'. We have produced some wonderful artwork too, using

watercolour and printing skills to create a London landscape.

Our Linford Year 1 children have been

taking part in fortnightly Relax Kids sessions, and have also been exploring programming on the Scratch Jr app on the iPads, creating their own animations.



This week has been full of celebration as we learnt about Shrove Tuesday 'pancake day', Chinese New Year and wore clothes we love for Valentine's Day. The children particularly enjoyed watching and performing a Chinese lion dance around the classroom!

#### **Bradgate Class**

This half term Bradgate have been transported to London where we have loved learning about some famous places and a huge event from 1666, The Great Fire of London. The children are now experts on this topic and have produced some fabulous work telling stories about

the fire and non-fiction texts about London today. The fire has also been our inspiration for some fabulous design technology work using sliders and levers to make a moving picture, all of which have turnout to be colourful and to move effectively.

We have been having a focus on times tables in our maths and are working very hard to learn our 2,3,5 and 10 times tables. Keep practising!

In science our study of materials has seen us testing and comparing materials to see which are the most suitable for different tasks.



After such a busy and wonderful half term, we are all excited for a holiday and then our new learning focus – where does our food come from?

We have had another great half term in Tyburn! This term we have been learning about 'Rivers', the children have enjoyed following the course of a river and describing the features of each stage. In science this term, we have been learning about the digestive system! We have had great fun following the journey of food and finding out some gruesome facts.

The children have worked particularly hard in English this term, they have produced some fantastic adventure stories and some fascinating non-chronological reports. I wonder if

the children can tell you something about their creatures?

In maths, we have been continuing our work on Multiplication and Division, we have also started learning about Length and Perimeter. The children have loved the challenge of finding equivalent lengths in millimetres, centimetres and metres!

Finally, the children have absolutely loved our Forest School sessions this term. It has been wonderful to take learning out of the classroom and to see our children flourish.



#### **Old John End of Spring 1 Half-Term Review**

We're at the end of our first Spring half-term! I hope everyone has a wonderful break.

This term, our big topic question was: Why was winning the Battle of Britain so important? The children have done lots of research and learning around this question, and they have really enjoyed learning more about

WW2 Britain and what the high stakes were for the British government in our war against Nazi Germany. The children still have so many questions about WW2, which I wish I had the time to answer, so don't be surprised if

your kids ask you extra questions about the time period!



This term, we've continued to strengthen our Maths knowledge with multiplication, division and expanded our learning around decimals and percentages. I've been really impressed by the children's climbing arithmetic scores and how many of the class are getting onto our "Dip & Pick" challenge cards. Well done, Old John!

In our writing, the class have written their own explanation texts about the evacuees and a topic of their choice, and have also written a newspaper article about Dunkirk, as well as their own fictional/non-

fictional news item of choice! Finally, the children will be finishing the term with a narrative of their choice. Our writing is going from strength-to-strength.

I hope the children have a fantastic break and recuperate some energy for next half-term! Thank you for all your hard work and support!


#### **Buddy Reading**

#### **Parent Maths Challenge**




Each shape stands for a number.
