The government is introducing changes to the way unauthorised school absence and term time holidays will be dealt with nationally from August 2024.

The main change is an increase in the fine payable.

All parents have been sent an email setting out these changes, let us know if you haven't received this. A reminder that BEP has introduced a new Charging, Remissions and Debt policy with immediate effect.

This requires all school meals to be paid for in advance. We would be grateful if you can make sure your child's meal account is settled before the end of the half term holiday and that it is kept topped up.

Linford Class

What another busy half-term we have had in Linford class! We have focused on the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears in English; retelling the story and writing a sorry letter from Goldilocks. We have also been writing instructions over the past couple of weeks, including how to brush our teeth and how to make a jam sandwich (of course we had to make and eat one first – yum!)



In Science we have been investigating the parts of plants, and in History we have been comparing homes from the past and in the present. In Art we have made observational drawings of plants and sculpted houses using clay.

In Maths, EYFS children have been focusing on shape patterns and Year 1 have been learning about money; counting coins in 2s, 5s and 10s. We have all been investigating ways to make amounts to 10 in Mastering Number sessions with the help from our 'Numberblocks'

friends.

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Class Updates

Tyburn Class

Tyburn class has had a fabulous half term, filled with hard work, enriching experiences, and memorable learning. The children thoroughly enjoyed their recent trip to the Botanical Gardens in Leicester, where they put their recent Geography learning to good use, finding out about various of Biomes. They were delighted by the variety of plant species, and the hands-on experience deepened their understanding of different ecosystems. Some highlights included the Latin dancing and the 'punching tree'. This trip linked seamlessly with our art topic on printing where we used leaves as an inspiration, resulting in beautiful finished projects that the children were proud of. In English, they demonstrated their motivation and commitment to excellence by writing persuasive letters to a café, urging the





owners to stop using single-use plastics. Their investigations revealed the alarming prevalence of microplastics in the oceans and even worse, in some of the fish we eat, motivating the children to strive for environmental





advocacy. The half term has been both enjoyable and productive, fostering friendship and collaboration amongst all. Wishing everyone a happy half term and a well-deserved rest!

Our Theme this term has been all about Ancient Greece, which is a favourite of Mr Brierley's because of his love of ancient history! The children have discussed and debated whether the Trojan Horse was real, a myth or a legend. Most of them settled on it being a 'legend' – partly true, but probably

exaggerated – but what do you think? Ask the kids and see what they learned!

In our English, we've enjoyed writing our first **dual text** – a daring tale of Theseus and the Minotaur in the Labyrinth – as well as a personal letter from Odysseus to his wife, Penelope, after his encounter with the minotaur Polyphemus. We had a heated discussion text about whether it would have been better to live in Ancient Athens or Ancient Sparta. I think you can guess where our sportier types might have preferred!



In our Maths, we've looked at position and direction and statistics, working on our knowledge of graphs and piecharts and other ways of collecting information. Can you still translate and reflect shapes? Sometimes it can be a bit of a puzzle to figure it out and there's some pitfalls to navigate – luckily, the children did really well at these bits of learning.

We've now got all of our end-of-year activities to look forward to next term, which are well-deserved for the whole year for working so hard.
