#### **Linford Class**

This year has absolutely flown by and we are so proud of the progress the children have made. During this final half-term, Linford class have had some wonderful opportunities... we have thoroughly enjoyed our Forest School sessions at Bradgate Park exploring nature; including building dens and bug hunting - even finding a frog and a lizard!







We learnt about life-cycles in Science and observed our class caterpillars grow bigger, turn into chrysalis' and emerge as beautiful butterflies before setting them free. In Geography we have been comparing and writing

about Antarctica and the Sahara Desert, and our English lessons have been inspired by the book Grandad's Island



by Benji Davies, with the children describing the beautiful setting using descriptive language. In maths, EYFS have been using language related to position and direction, and Year 1 have been learning to tell the time to o'clock and half-past.

Sports Day was a roaring success and the children gave it their all during the afternoon of sunshine -well done! Thank you parents for all your support this

#### **Bradgate Class**

We have had a wonderful term in Bradgate, filled with many memorable moments, including the joy of seeing the sun shine brightly.

Our Sports Day was phenomenal! The children actively participated in all activities, demonstrating exceptional teamwork and enthusiasm.



This term has flown by, and we've focused on improving our students' spelling skills. Each Nonarchy student received a blue spelling log, and they've enjoyed practicing their spellings in various creative ways. We encourage them to continue practicing over the summer using these logs. We've also worked hard on understanding time, position, and movement. The

children have started telling the time and applying key vocabulary in their daily activities. We hope they continue to develop these skills over the summer.

To ensure our students are on the right reading level, we've assessed their progress and provided books that challenge their fluency and comprehension. We encourage children to read with an adult at home and maintain a reading log. Next term, we will continue reading with the children each week and making notes in their logs. Those who read at least three times a week and have their logs signed will earn a stamp in their reading records and receive five Dojo points.



We wish all Bradgate students a fantastic summer holiday. We will miss our Year Twos as they move on to Key Stage Two and beyond, and we look forward to welcoming our new students and seeing our current Year Ones move up. Have a great summer!
