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### **Class Updates**

### **Linford Class**

In Linford class we have had a fun and busy start to the academic year. The new children have settled in so well and you would not believe they are only in Year R based on the work they are completing! Our

Year 1 children have grown in confidence being the 'eldest' and we are loving hearing their voices and seeing them take the lead.

This term has been a creative one with a particular focus on geography.

Year R have built and collaged their own houses. They have drawn maps and talked about who is in their family.

Year 1 children have been writing about Leicestershire and learning about famous landmarks.



All children have been engaging well in daily phonics and we ask you continue to practice reading regularly over the next week.



#### **Bradgate Class**

Bradgate have had a great start to the year. The children have been doing lots of fantastic learning and trying hard this half term.

We had really successful story writing this term and an excellent showcase to the parents and adults; a big thank you to those who came, the children really appreciated it. Following this, we went onto writing all about ourselves and creating another piece of writing about our friend. We used lots of amazing adjectives and children created some fantastic portraits of their friends.



Children have been learning to count up to 20 and up to 100. Children are learning to use lots of different techniques and representing the learning in lots of different ways. We've been learning that maths is not just about numbers but also about solving problems. We have created real life problems and looked at how we can solve them. We really need to focus on reading the question carefully and children are starting to be a lot more independent with their questioning.

We enjoyed our walk around Newtown Linford. It was great to have so many adults and children bringing in lots of resources which helped to make a fantastic lesson. Children discussed within their group and were able to show different areas of Leicester as well as areas in our local area and further afield.



Children were really engaged practising for the harvest assembly as well as preparing for the scarecrow festival. We hope that you're able to access the QR code and watch the beautiful singing of their song in French.

All the staff in Bradgate would like children to continue to read at home. Staff around the school have mentioned how brilliantly our children's learning and reading has come on. Would like to encourage you to read a couple of nights over the next week and hope you have a lovely break.



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## **Class Updates**

### **Tyburn Class**

We have had a brilliant first half term, all of the children have settled into Tyburn quickly and have made a fantastic start to the year. This term we have been learning about Ancient Egypt, particularly focusing on the structure of society. The children have also spent some time learning about the role of a pharaoh, scribes and Howard Carter's famous discovery. As part of our topic, we went to Leicester Museum and Art Gallery and learnt some fascinating facts all about life in Ancient Egypt.





In English this term, we have been writing warning stories, instructions and recounts. We looked carefully at the past tense and using conjunctions to expand our writing. The children were able to create some fantastic stories, using some really powerful vocabulary and ideas.

In maths, we have been working on Place Value and Addition and Subtraction. The children have done some brilliant work representing, partitioning and comparing numbers to 1,000 and 10,000 (Year 4).

Well done again for this half term and thank you to parents and carers for your continued support.

### **Old John Class**

What a terrific start to the year! Well done, Old John.

Our theme this term has been "Medicine Over Time," and of course, we've learnt about it in grisly fashion. The kids should now be able to tell you how some sailors used to deal with scurvy using some natural remedies, what some people did to try and cure the Black Death, and what Florence Nightingale thought was London's biggest health problem and not the dirty water! Despite the grisly details, the children should now understand the meaning of 'life expectancy' and why it increased over the years, but very very slowly!

In English, we've written a letter to our future selves, a narrative with an 'escape' theme (we used the Sick House during the Black Death!) and written a balanced argument about the creation of the first vaccine. The children have also had their own opportunities to write their own 'invented' stories of each of these, and their creativity is amazing!

In Maths, we have been working on our place value, four operations and more. This has been challenging but the class are doing some fantastic work.

Of course, well done to Old John for representing the school so well during Coffee & Cake—both socially and in the baking department!
