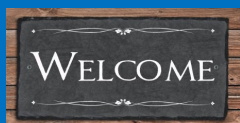
Thank you for your continued support, and we look forward to a fantastic term ahead.

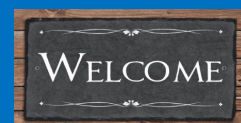
